Report on Bridge Course-6th June to 14th June 2019

A seven day bridge course on Communicative English was organized by the Management for the first and second year students from 6th June to 14th June 2019. Rev.Fr. Arul Raj, sdb director, Don Bosco spoken English Academy, Dindigul, and Rev. Brother Felix sdb handled classes on all the seven days. The course aimed at covering some important grammar topics and making students speak on creating various real life contexts.
